## Intro

---

Walking in Kingdom Multiplication explores the truth that what God gives us was never meant to be kept, but released. Jesus modeled this by sending out the seventy-two, showing that multiplication comes through entrusting and releasing, not hoarding or preserving. The Kingdom spreads like yeast—quiet, unseen, unstoppable—when we open our hands and let go. This teaching calls us to identify who God is asking us to pour into and to send them further than we could go alone.

# Walking in Kingdom Multiplication: Releasing What's Not Yours to Keep

## Focus

Kingdom multiplication isn't about preserving what you have or building a name for yourself. It's about releasing what was never yours to keep. Legacy in the Kingdom isn't monuments—it's people sent, empowered, and released. Multiplication happens when we pour out, not when we hold back.

---

## Key Truths

- Jesus modeled multiplication by sending, not hoarding (Luke 10:1–2).
  - We multiply by entrusting others, not by trying to secure permanence (2 Timothy 2:2).
  - The Kingdom spreads like yeast, not like monuments (Matthew 13:33).
  - When we grip too tightly, we slow Heaven's momentum.

## Teaching Flow

### 1. Jesus Sent the Seventy-Two

“After this the Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them two by two ahead of Him to every town...” – Luke 10:1

- Jesus could have centralized everything, but He multiplied influence by releasing others.
  - Kingdom leadership is measured not by how many gather around you, but by how many are sent from you.
  - Illustration: Jesus trusted ordinary people with extraordinary authority—and the Kingdom spread.

### 2. Multiplication Happens by Release, Not Permanence

“And the things you have heard from me... entrust to faithful people who will be able to teach others also.” – 2 Timothy 2:2

- Multiplication requires trust and transfer.
- Legacy isn't secured by what we hold but by who we equip.
- When we cling to influence, knowledge, or opportunities, we choke multiplication.

---

### 3. The Kingdom Spreads Like Yeast, Not Monuments

“The Kingdom of Heaven is like leaven... until it was all leavened.” – Matthew 13:33

- Yeast works invisibly, spreading through contact and release.
- Monuments may inspire, but yeast transforms.
- The Kingdom grows in unseen places when we stop trying to control outcomes.

Contrast: Monuments preserve the past. Yeast multiplies into the future.

---

### 4. Holding On Slows Heaven’s Momentum

- Faith that clutches is fear in disguise.
- What you refuse to release, God cannot multiply.
- Multiplication flows when we open our hands—trusting the God who gave it in the first place.

Reflection: What if the thing you’re gripping tight is the very thing Heaven is trying to multiply through release?

---

### Activation

Prompt: Ask the Lord to highlight one person you’re meant to pour into this week.

- Who can you entrust with what God has deposited in you?
- What step can you take to release, not retain?
- This isn’t about building a following. It’s about sending someone further than you could go alone.

Write down their name and one way you will intentionally invest in them this week.

---

### Declarations

- I am a steward, not an owner—what I’ve been given belongs to God.
- I release freely so Heaven can multiply abundantly.
- I will not cling to influence; I will send it forward.
- The Kingdom in me is meant to spread, not be stored.
- What I pour out, God multiplies.
